Whatcom County Community H1N1 Flu Clinics

Update as of 5:00 PM 10/22/09

The Bellingham H1N1 vaccination clinic that was previously scheduled for October 22 has been re-scheduled for Wednesday, October 28. A rural clinic will also be held October 29 in Deming. The clinics will be limited to only those high priority groups who live, work, or go to school in Whatcom County.

The H1N1 Vaccine Clinic Call Center Line will close at 3:00 p.m. Friday October 23 or when all appointment slots are filled. The H1N1 vaccination clinic scheduled for October 28 in Bellingham is full. The clinic scheduled for October 29 in Deming has limited slots available. The call center number is (360) 778-8170. Call volumes are high so callers should be patient.

If you are in one of the following groups, please call **(360) 778-8170** to schedule an appointment. Space is limited and appointments will be accepted until all slots are filled.

- Pregnant women
- Household contacts of infants less than 6 months of age
- Children ages 6 months to 5 years
- Children ages 5 years to 18 years with medical conditions (such as: asthma, heart disease, immune disorders, or neurological conditions) that put them at risk for flu complications
- Healthcare providers and emergency responders

Both nasal mist and shots will be available at the clinics.

COST: There is no out-of-pocket cost for the H1N1 vaccine to those attending a clinic. *However, if you have insurance please bring your insurance cards as an administrative fee may be billed to your insurance provider.*

Additional H1N1 clinics will be scheduled as more vaccine shipments are received.

Once these priority groups have been offered the vaccine, then other health care workers, children ages 5-24 years, and individuals 25-64 years of age with high risk medical conditions will be in the next priority groups. **By late November, it is anticipated that there will be enough vaccine for anyone requesting the H1N1 vaccine.**
